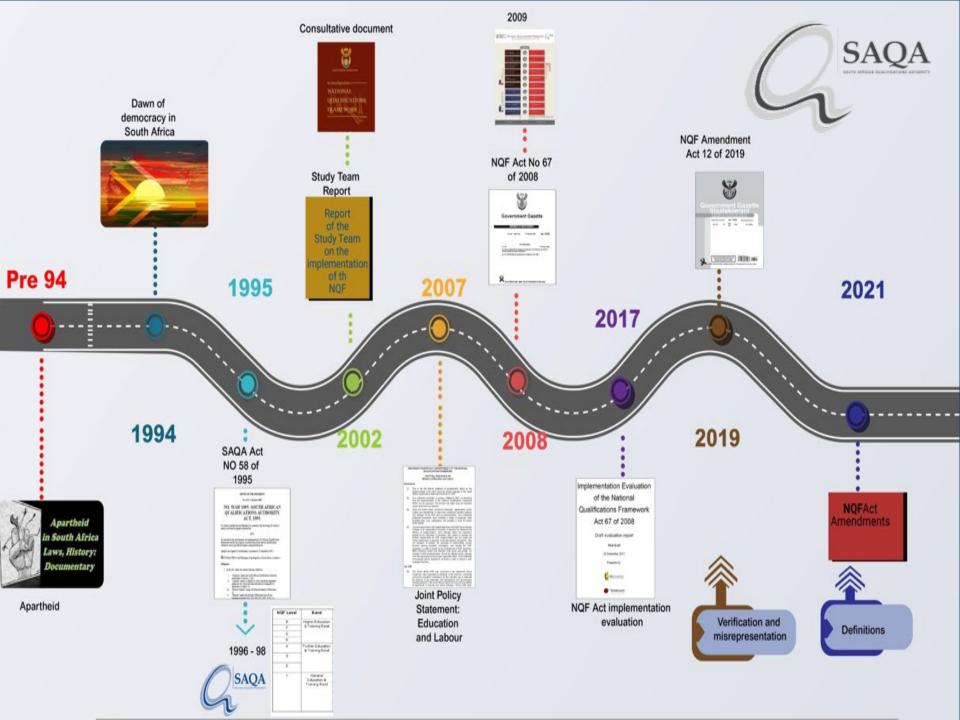

1995 - 2008

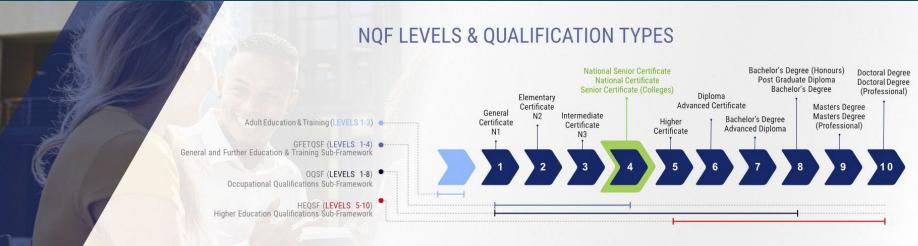
- 1995: SAQA Act No. 58 of 1995
- 1996: SAQA established/ first SAQA Board meeting
- 1996 2008: SAQA legislated quality assurance functions, including development of qualifications, accrediting ETQA's and delegating certification
- 1996 2008: SAQA developed and implemented first NQF policies
 - Quality assurance and Standard setting
 - RPL
 - Assessment

2009+

- 2009: Quality Councils est.
- 2009 present: SAQA coordinating the three NQF Sub-Frameworks and Foreign qualification evaluation and advice
- 2009-present: Intensive research in support of NQF policy development
- 2010 2012: Development and oversight of the NQF Policy Suite
- 2015: Full FQ evaluation
- 2017: eSCOE (paperless by 2021)
- 2021 2022 Organisational review and downscaling

General and Further Education

- Three (3) Streams model
- Pilots: GETC to replace ABET 4 and Implementation of the 'Adult Matric' NASCA
- 23 000 public schools
- 2 200 private schools

Occupational Education and Training 2013 OQSF Policy

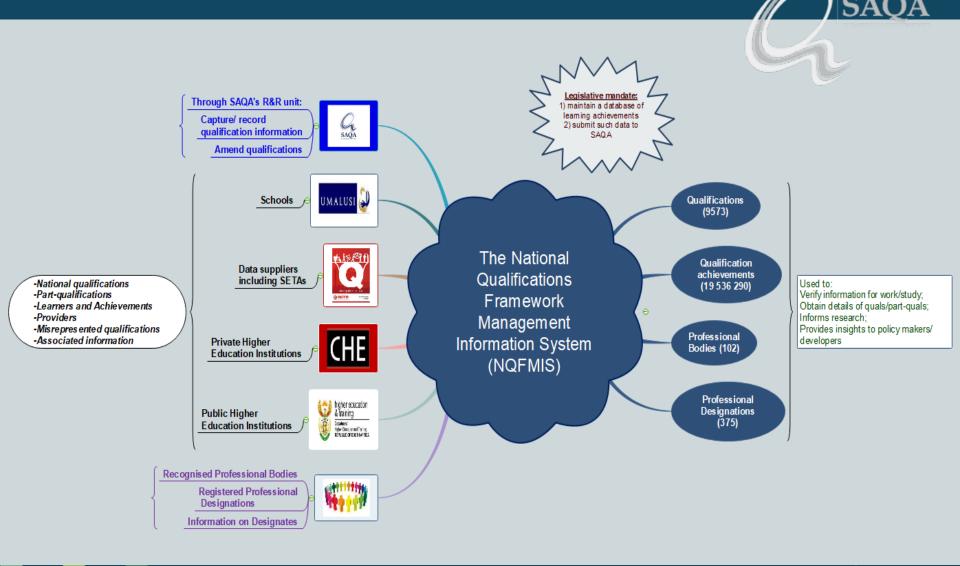
Occupational qualification per level

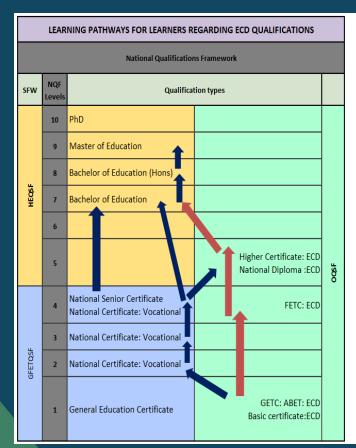

Professional bodies and the NQF

Inclusion of Professional bodies and designations on the National Qualifications Framework

National regulation including criteria for transformation, access and continuous professional development

Approximately 1.2 million designated professionals on the SAQA NLRD

Promoting public understanding of, and trust in, qualifications and professions through the establishment of a nationally regulated system

Ability to track individual's qualification and designation pathway

- Sub-framework differentiation is critical, but central principles must be retained

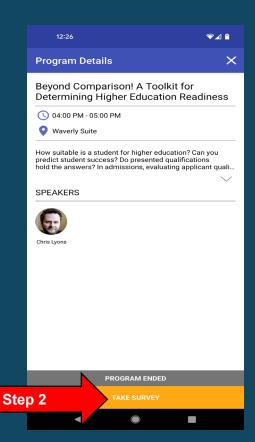
